SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Entry forms and entry fees of 25 pence per class, photographs and limericks (classes 62 and 64), children's posters and poems (classes 67 to 72) will be received by the committee in the Hulse Hall on Tuesday 14th August from 7 p.m. to 8 p.m.**
- Forms and fees may also be sent to The Secretary, The Breamore Horticultural Society, 15 Bruyn Road, Fordingbridge, SP6 1QZ to arrive by Tuesday 14th August.
- 3. No entry fees for child exhibitors in section four, the children's section. Every child's age must be shown on each exhibit and name put on the back of own work.**
- In Section One all produce shown must be grown in the exhibitor's own garden or allotment with the exception of Classes 25, 26 and 27 that must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for at least 2 months prior to the date of the show.
- A member of the committee may visit a competitor and shall be allowed to inspect any intending exhibit.
- Labelling of exhibits and the condition and preparation of vegetables with careful washing including roots will be considered by the judges.
- 7. Exhibits may be staged between 7 p.m. and 8.30 p.m. on the evening before the show or between 7.30 a.m. and 10 a.m. on the day of the show. The hall will be cleared for judging by 10.15 a.m.** No exhibit shall be removed from the hall until after the presentation of awards. Only exhibitors and officials will be allowed in the hall at the time of staging.
- In the event of a single entry in a class the judge will decide whether to award or withhold a prize.
- The decision of the judges shall be final on matters of quality but any other genuine complaint will be investigated if made in writing and handed to the Secretary with a deposit of 50p not later than 4 p.m. on the day of the show.
- Only one entry per person is permitted in each class.
- A husband and wife must exhibit as individual entrants.
- The committee will take every care of all exhibits but will not be responsible for loss or damage.
- The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry at any time without giving a reason.
- The judging of the horticultural exhibits will be by a National Vegetable Society Judge or a Royal Horticultural Society Judge according to The RHS Show Handbook.8th edition revised in 2016
- Floral art exhibits will be judged by a NAFAS (National Association of Flower Arrangement Societies) Judge and according to the NAFAS Competition Manual.
- All cooked items must be covered with cling film.
- 17. All cups, trophies and the shield are perpetual challenge awards and are held only until the next show.** Winners are responsible for their safe keeping and are liable for any loss or damage.
- 18. Please return the cups, trophies and shield to the Secretary by Tuesday 14th August 2018.**
- Entries in classes 61 and 63 must not have been entered in a previous Breamore Flower Show.
- Prize money will be available for collection from the Treasurer and Assistant Treasurer from 2.30 p.m. on the day of the show.

Use vouchers by December 31 2017 for seeds via mail order only; not redeemable for non-seed items or in conjunction with the additional Allotment Club and Garden Club Service discount.

The class is for a vase of fresh, mixed, flowering, cut stems containing a total of between 5 and 10, taken from any home-grown, flowering plant and a minimum of two different KINDS of plants. *Please note that two varieties of the same plants are NOT two kinds.* The different kinds of plants need to be taken from different genera. For instance, pinks, carnations and sweet william which are all Dianthus would not be classed as different kinds. The display is judged out of a total of 35points: 25 points for the colour, form, condition, quality and freshness of the flowers on display; 10 points for the overall presentation and effects of the flowers of the vase. **The vase will be viewed from all directions. The vase,** any vessel that can be used to hold cut flowers and which is taller than it is wide at its widest point, can be any shape or size and made from any material but **must be in proportion to the display.** No marks are awarded for the vase itself. No dried or silk flowers are allowed nor accessories such as bows and additional foliage. **Stems used in the display must be showing flowers only; no seed-heads or berries. Foliage which is growing naturally from the flowering stem, and still attached to that stem, is allowed.** Use of packing material including florist's foam, to keep the stems in place, is allowed.

All classes in this section are exhibits in which any natural plant material may be used. Natural plant material must predominate. An exhibit is contained within a space as specified in a show schedule. Accessories but not artificial plant material may be included. The roots or the cut ends of the stems of fresh plant material must be in water or water-retaining material. Exceptions include air plants, cacti, fruits, fungi, grass turf, lichen, moss, succulents, vegetables and long-lasting plant material which will remain turgid (firm from adequate moisture) for the duration of the show. Exhibits are to be viewed and judged from the front except classes 48 and 50 which will be judged from all around. Exhibits will be staged on 75cm/ 30"high tables covered in pastel green hessian. Classes 43 and 44 will be staged in white niches.

HEMECRAFT RECIPES:

Lemon Drizzle (Class 57)

Ingredients:

225g unsalted butter,
softened
225g caster sugar
4 eggs
finely grated zest 1 lemon
225g self-raising flour

For the drizzle topping:

juice 1½ lemons
85g caster sugar

Method:

Heat oven to 180C/fan 160C/gas 4.
Beat together unsalted butter and caster sugar until pale and creamy.
Add 4 eggs, one at a time, slowly mixing through.
Sift in flour, then add the finely grated zest of 1 lemon and mix until well combined.
Line a loaf tin (8 x 21cm) with greaseproof paper, spoon in the mixture and level the top with a spoon.
Bake for 45-50 mins until a thin skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.
While the cake is cooling in its tin, mix together the lemon juice and caster sugar to make the drizzle.
Prick the warm cake all over with a skewer or fork, then pour over the drizzle.

Brownies (CLASS 60)

Ingredients:

250g butter
½ cup cocoa
1 ½ cups castor sugar
4 eggs
1 cup flour
1 tsp baking powder
1 tsp vanilla essence

Method

Preheat oven to 180°C bake. Line an 18 x 28cm sponge roll tin with baking paper.
Melt butter in a saucepan large enough to mix all ingredients in.
Mix in cocoa, remove from heat and stir in sugar
Add eggs and mix well, then add vanilla essence. Sift in flour and baking powder and mix to combine. Pour into prepared tin.
Bake for 25-30 minutes or until brownie springs back when touched lightly.
